2024 MLA Educational Workshops



This year, the MLA—in cooperation with the Montana Forest Council—is sponsoring the following continuing-education workshops:

- <u>Contracting 201</u> ... 7 ALP Credits ... Fee \$20/person. Tuesday, April 2, Missoula. This class will have a more in-depth focus on navigating contracts, a follow up to last year's 101 class.
- Written Safety Program... 2 ALP credits FREE... An opportunity to start your loss control manual or refresh and update an existing one. (Libby, Kalispell, Missoula)
- Forest Stewardship Workshop for Loggers ... 32 ALP credits... Fee \$200 for members... \$350 non-members. April 23rd 25th. The FSW for loggers is the basic building block of the ALP program. This workshop has been revised and includes pre-work prior to the start of the classes. Meals @ the MLA office are included. Pre-registration is required.
- What's New in Logging ... 6 ALP credits ... Fee \$20/person ... Friday, April 19 in Kalispell. This class will cover various topics all centered around diversifying and improving your current operation.
- Forest Management Practicum (Advanced SFI) ... 8 ALP/PLH credits ... Fee \$20/person, May 2 @ Lubrecht Experimental Forest. This will include ecology, hydrology, soils, silviculture, aesthetics, recreation, economics, wildlife and the sustainability of all. This workshop satisfies the 8-hour requirement for Advanced SFI.
- Montana Forestry BMP & SMZ... 8 ALP/PLH credits ... Fee: \$20/person. This one-day workshop will improve your knowledge of Montana's Forestry Best Management Practices and our Streamside Management Zone Law & Rules. ALP loggers are required to take BMP/SMZ training at least every three years. Classes will be May 6 in Libby, May 7 in Kalispell, May 8 in Missoula and May 9 in Deer Lodge.
- <u>Log Scaling Workshop</u> ... 8 ALP Credits ... Fee \$15/person. May 21 in Kalispell and May 23rd in Deer Lodge. This class is designed for the contractor, his crew and agency foresters.

You will learn the basics of Scribner scale rules, so by the end of the class, you can tell if a log is 1/3 sound, needed long butting, etc. We will also go over agency contracts and how Scribner applies to each. We will also go over all aspects of log quality and the financial results to the mills. What you need to bring:
